WASHINGTON, D.C. (April 5, 2011) – The <u>ADAP Advocacy Association</u>, also known as <u>aaa+</u>, today announced that it is hosting its 2011 Annual Conference, together with its Lead Sponsor the <u>AIDS Healthcare Foundation</u> (AHF) – in partnership with the <u>Community Access National Network</u> (CANN) and <u>Housing Works</u> – on Tuesday, July 5th - Thursday, July 7th in Washington, DC. This summit, themed "AIDS DRUG ASSISTANCE PROGRAM Crisis: When will Washington come to the rescue," will be open to all ADAP stakeholders nationwide. "As we prepare to host our 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference, thousands of Americans living with HIV/AIDS are languishing on ADAP waiting lists as Washington succumbs to partisan politics, spends billions on three unnecessary and costly wars, all while trying to balance the federal budget on the backs of the poor, disabled and elderly," argued **Brandon M. Macsata**, CEO of the ADAP Advocacy Association. "Both the President and Congress dating back to 2005 have not appropriated adequate federal funding for the AIDS Drug Assistance Program – a program known to provide an excellent 'Return on Investment' to the taxpayer. ADAPs improve the nation's public health system by keeping people living with HIV/AIDS healthy and out of the hospital, but also by reducing transmission of HIV."

As of April 1st, there were 7,745 individuals in 11 states on ADAP waiting lists, including Arkansas: 51 people, Florida: 3,905 people, Georgia: 1,278 people, Idaho: 11 people, Louisiana: 831 people, Montana: 22 people, North Carolina: 189 people, Ohio: 311 people, South Carolina: 565 people, Virginia: 579 people and Wyoming: 3 people.
