HIV: United States

According to the Pew Research Center, about 3.45 million Muslims reside in the United States (~1.1% of the total population).



It is unknown how HIV has impacted the U.S.'s third largest religion:

diagnosed with HIV living with HIV linked to care living with HIV retained in care living with HIV virally suppressed

"We know that living with HIV and embracing spirituality leads to better emotional, mental, and physical health. Yet, no data presently exists showing how many HIV-positive Muslims reside in the United States. More needs to be done to identify how the HIV epidemic is impacting our Muslim brothers and sisters."



Compared to Christian peers, Muslims were:


Less likely to have full-time employment More likely to be laid off because of COVID More likely to be classified as an "essential employee"



In U.S. counties with large **Muslim communities, COVID-19** has presented significant risks.


Cook County, Illinois Muslim Population 3.87% Ranked 35th (Source: ARDA, 2010)




Wayne County, Michigan Muslim Population 4.63% Ranked 37th (Source: ARDA)
