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ADAP Advocacy Association Releases 2018 Annual Report

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The ADAP Advocacy Association today released its 2018 Annual Report – which highlights the organization’s ongoing commitment to transparency with advocacy to promote and protect the AIDS Drug Assistance Program (“ADAP”). The report also includes important information about its Correctional Health Project designed to address the unique needs among formerly incarcerated populations living with HIV/AIDS.

“Respect is earned, and our organization has earned the respect of its funders because they recognize the valuable contributions we make to patient advocacy,” said **Brandon M. Macsata**, CEO of the ADAP Advocacy Association. “Since the birth of the ADAP Advocacy Association in July 2007, transparency has been a core guiding principle of our organization and its advocacy activities. *And...we will continue to do so.*”

ADAP continues to serve as a lifeline to thousands of people living with HIV/AIDS, including many marginalized communities.

In FY2017, Congress appropriated \$1.4 billion for the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program Part B programs, with \$898.8 million appropriated to ADAP specifically. According to the National Alliance of State & Territorial AIDS Directors’ (NASTAD) ADAP Monitoring Project Annual Report, funding was also allocated to 24 Part B Supplemental grants, nine Part B ADAP Supplemental Treatment grants, and nine ADAP Emergency Relief grants. Additional funding sources included Part A contribution allocated to Part B (2), State contributions (31), drug rebates (46), and other State/Federal funds (23).
