## ADAP Advocacy Announces Health Fireside Chat – Atlanta, GA

Two-day policy retreat entirely dedicated to the Inflation Reduction Act and its emerging adverse impact on patient access to care and treatment

WASHINGTON, D.C. – ADAP Advocacy today announced its 2025 Health Fireside Chat in Atlanta, Georgia, which will be held on September 25th-27th. The meeting serves as a follow-up to discussions on the Inflation Reduction Act held earlier this year in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The **Health Fireside Chats** (previously called HIV/AIDS Fireside Chats) assemble key stakeholder groups to discuss pertinent issues facing people living with HIV/AIDS and other chronic health conditions. In continuing the organization's strong commitment to patient-centric advocacy, each event will include local patient advocates to ensure "that the voice of persons living with HIV/AIDS shall always be at the table and the center of the discussion."

The Inflation Reduction Act and its potential adverse impact on patient access to care and treatment will be the sole focus for public policy and public health stakeholders invited to attend the Atlanta Health Fireside Chat. Topics for discussion will include challenges being faced by community pharmacies, more restrictive drug formularies, non-medical switching, and patients absorbing greater costs due to shifts from co-pays to co-insurance. These issues also have an important interplay with other key public health programs, including Medicaid and the 340B Drug Pricing Program.
