


340B: Too Big to Fail? Hospital CEO Pay Gap



The 340B Drug Pricing Program was designed to help poor patients access healthcare services. Yet, despite this program growing to **\$66 billion**, manufacturer rebates are being used to fund **excessive compensation** for hospital CEOs. The 340B Program wasn't designed to pad the pockets of these healthcare executives. This system is failing them!

Hospitals tend to be **MAJOR EMPLOYERS** in their communities, employing many **LOWER-WAGE EMPLOYEES**.

Hospitals are **ONE OF THE TOP 5 EMPLOYERS** in 22 states.

While the GAPS BETWEEN CEO AND AVERAGE WORKER WAGES were wider at teaching, urban, and large health system hospitals, nonteaching, nonurban, smaller, and standalone hospitals saw the highest increases in CEO wages.
