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ADAP Advocacy Rescinds Three-Year Florida Travel Advisory

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WASHINGTON, D.C. – ADAP Advocacy today announced it has rescinded its [travel advisory](#) for people living with HIV/AIDS, which was issued in May 2023. The three-year-old travel advisory had applied to ADAP Advocacy board members, staff, consultants, and scholarship-funded patient advocates, and had also suspended hosting any patient advocacy events in Florida.

Brandon M. Macsata, CEO of ADAP Advocacy, stated: **"Whereas ADAP Advocacy continues to hold deep concerns over certain Florida statutes and healthcare-related policies and their potential impact on marginalized communities, situational policy changes and uncertainty impacting the state's AIDS Drug Assistance Program warrant our change in strategy. We have been closely monitoring proposed changes to the Florida ADAP and working behind the scenes to address them, and part of our new approach involves local community engagement that cannot be achieved remotely."**
